Scientific Snippets

With spring around the corner (we hope), perhaps it is time for a reminder about some of those plants that are toxic to horses.

1. From the tree family, keep an eye out for: black locust, black walnut, horsechestnut, peach, oak, and wild cherry. And of course, gorging on apples can cause colic, as a cupful of seeds can poison people or horses from the cyanide released in the stomach acid.
2. From the shrub family, have you seen the following on your property? boxwood, mountain laurel, rhododendron, singletary pea, privet, hydrangea, and ground hemlock.
3. Fragrant flowers can also pose a challenge, such as: poison or water hemlock, dogbane, milkweed, cocklebur, sneezeweed, yellow star thistle, rape, corn cockle, leafy spurge, alsike clover, crimson clover (overripe), red or sweet clover (from a fungus when hay was stored damp), coffeeweed, lupine, rattlebox, hairy vetch, fitweed, St. Johnswort, beefsteak plant, ground ivy, autumn crocus, death camas, false hellebore, onions, squirrel corn, pokeweed, buckwheat, buttercup, larkspur, marsh marigold, monkshood, foxglove, buffalo bur, jimsonweed, bull nettle, and nightshade.
4. Imagine there are even some grasses out there that aren't good for horses, like: arrowgrass, dalis grass (fungus), fescue (fungus), squirreltail grass, yellow bristle grass, and horsetails.
5. Bracken fern is in a class of its own, and horses will not typically eat it if other choices are available, but toxic thiaminase shouldn't be forgotten.
6. For the fall, keep in mind that the bark and wilted or dried leaves of red maple trees are quite toxic to horses.

If you would like more information, these facts were gleaned from the "Horse Owner's Field Guide to Toxic Plants" by Sandra M. Burger and Anthony P. Knight.

----- The Connecticut Dressage Association Issues a Challenge to Region 8 GMOs

CDA's stated mission is "Promoting Dressage in the Northeast Through Education And Opportunity". CDA's Board decided to issue a challenge to all GMOs in Region 8. In order to raise funds to support our Region North American Junior and Young Rider Teams it was decided to challenge all Region 8 GMOs to donate one dollar for every member they have listed as of May 1, 2007. The monies donated will go to our Region 8 NaJrYr Teams for the North American Junior and Young Rider championships to be held July 31 - August 5, 2007 at the Virginia horse Center, Lexington, Virginia. When 50% of the Region 8 GMOs including NEDA meet our challenge CDA will at that point double our donation. As an added bonus, Centerline Events has stated that if we get a 75% response from Region 8's GMOs they will match CDA's original donation. CDA's Board thought this would be an excellent way to for fill our stated Mission and to support all Junior and Young Riders in Region 8. We hope all GMOs will respond to this challenge, to help the future generation of dressage riders to reached their goals.

* The non-member AA rider has a choice. The chart describes a \$55 fee to be a non-member AA rider at a show. If you do not really care if you are an AA for this one time show, you only need to pay the non-member fee (\$20) plus dressage discipline fee (\$5). If you absolutely want to compete as an AA, then you have to pay this AA fee (\$30) and it is only good for one show. At this point, it would be STRONGLY suggested you just join USEF and pay \$45 plus the \$13 dressage discipline fee. Then you sign the AA part of the membership and you can show anytime as AA member paying nothing more.

** Just a reminder! Trainer on the entry form is the ADULT who is responsible for the horse on the grounds. This person must be present and is the person who named if the horse is drug tested or case of abuse. The coach is the person who coaches you before the class, not the trainer.

*** Memberships/Registrations/Recordings must be valid before the qualifying ride for the score to count.

1. Levels:

Training through Grand Prix, GAIG/USDF Qualifying, North American YR Championship, Region 8 Qualifier, Markel Young Horse Qualifier, and CFC.

2. Awards:

All 1st place will receive a trophy. Six ribbons will be presented in each class. Awards for high scoring Open, Jr/YR, Adult Amateur, and CDA Member. To qualify for CDA member award you must be a member by closing date. To qualify for Adult Amateur award you must be an USEF AA. Cajun's Billy Best Vintage Horse Award—Awarded to the highest scoring horse 20 yrs or older. Breed High Point Awards must have the Horse's Dam and Sire indicated on the entry form, and a copy of registration must be provided to be eligible for the award. Score must be 58% or better. MFS or YH Tests do not count.

—The American Hanoverian Society Trophy for the high score Hanoverian.

—The American Trakehner Assoc Award for the high score Trakehner.

—The Friesian Sport Horse Registry Award for the Friesian high score each day of show. Please direct inquires to Barbara Schwartz at 908-995-7380.

3. Entries:

Class #70–\$30. Training thru Fourth, USDF Freestyles—\$40 per class. All FEI classes—\$50 per class. GAIG/USDF qualifying classes add \$10 to class fee. All entries MUST submit USEF and USDF documents for rider, owner, trainer and horse as appropriate for entry, a \$12 drug fee (\$7 Drug&Med fee, \$5 USEF fee), and non-refundable \$10 office fee. No entry accepted without a negative Coggins dated within 12 months of show. Please include \$20 USEF non-member fee and/or \$5 discipline fee if applicable for non-Jrs. All entries must have three signatures including emergency info. Make checks payable to CDA. Refunds will be given for cancellations received in writing,

email, or fax before the closing date less \$10 office fee. Unconditionally, no refunds after closing date or for 'acts of god' which require management to cancel classes or day(s) of competition. Non-negotiable check will be charged \$25. Post entries will be accepted to fill scratches with a \$20 post entry fee. Non-competing horses if space available, \$45 plus office fee.

4. Times:

Times will be on the website, www.centerlineevents.com, at least one week prior to the competition. If you wish for your times to be sent, please include SASE.

5. Stabling:

All stabling will be in the indoors. No Tent stabling. Limited number of temporary stalls with full doors available at \$125 for duration. No shavings provided. A stall cleaning deposit of \$25 on a separate check is required. Tack stalls only if space permits. No refunds on stabling after closing date (except for stall deposit). May arrive on Friday afternoon, must vacate by 7pm Sunday.

From New York : Take I-84 East to exit 15; left onto Rt 6 (Main Street). *Follow thru Woodbury and take left onto Rt 61 North. At intersection Rt 61 and Rt 132 (red blinking light) go straight. The farm is 1/2 mile on the right (#116).

From Mass : Take I-84 West to exit 15; right onto Rt 6. Follow above directions from *.

From CT Shoreline : Take Rt 8 North to exit 38; left at end of ramp, Next traffic light make left. At stop sign go left and immediately bear right onto Rt 109 West. **Take Rt 109 to Morris. At intersection of Rt 109 and Rt 61, make left onto Rt 61 South. Farm is 1 mile past the Bethlehem Fair Grounds on the left. (#116)

From North CT : Take Rt 8 South to exit 38; at light go straight onto Rt 109. At the next light bear right and continue on Rt 109 West. Follow above directions from **.

Two sand arenas with indoor and outdoor sand warm up. All competition arenas are 20m x 60m.

Management reserves the right to combine, divide, or cancel any class. Farrier on the grounds. Veterinarian information will be posted. All dogs must be leashed.

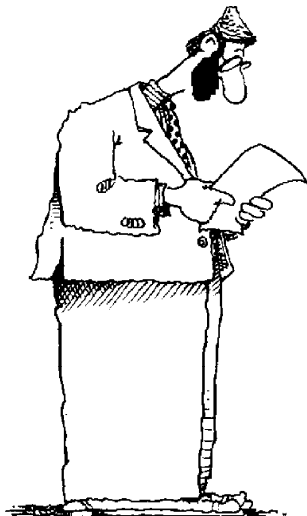
